The Brandywine Valley
November 20-23, 2008*

Plan to join us for fun and fellowship during our fall trip to the culturally rich Brandywine Valley. This enchanting area offers such varied attractions and diverse experiences, it's possible to visit over and over, and come away with new memories each time.

Highlights include:

- ❖ A private lunch and guided tour of **The Hagley Museum and Library**, the site of the origin of the du Pont Company and the first **du Pont family home**.
- ❖ Docent-led tours of **the Brandywine River Museum**, with time to browse special exhibitions.
- ❖ A tour of **N.C. Wyeth's home**; see where this renowned artist worked and raised his remarkably talented children.
- ❖ A visit to the **Brandywine Battlefield Park**, a national park honoring the largest single-day land battle in the Revolutionary War, the Battle of Brandywine on September 11, 1777. This tour includes two historic houses, the Ring House used by Gen. George Washington, and the Gilpin House.
- ❖ A visit to **Mill Grove**, the first American home of **John James Audubon**, the renowned artist and naturalist. This three-story stone farmhouse serves as a museum displaying original Audubon prints, oil paintings and memorabilia.



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- ❖ A private Yuletide Tour of **Winterthur** to view the elegant interiors of the du Pont mansion bedecked in holiday finery. We'll make time to enjoy special exhibits, including one on holiday-themed table settings and another on antique samplers and other textiles used as records of family histories. Then you can visit the fine gift shops or take the garden tram.
- ❖ A stop in **Kennett Square, Pennsylvania**, the mushroom capital of the United States. We'll visit The Mushroom Cap, and further our education on the cultivation of mushrooms, then shop for fresh mushrooms and unique gifts. We'll end the day with a mushroom-oriented dinner in the Kennett Square area.
- ❖ Famous **Longwood Gardens** will greet us with its seasonal display and time to enjoy exquisite flowers, ancient trees, sparkling fountains and exotic plants.
- ❖ Enjoy a special four-course dinner at **Simon Pearce** in our own private dining room overlooking the Brandywine River. Simon Pearce is not only famous for his restaurant, but also is a noted potter and glass blower. Before dinner, we'll have time to visit his studio and display, learn about his crafts and of course visit the gift shop.
